

Year 10 Child Development Overview

Unit	Duration (lessons)	Learning Objectives/Outcomes
Health and well-being for child development	50 hours	<p>Becoming a parent is one of life's major experiences, and it is also one of life's major responsibilities. Responsibility for the well-being of a child starts before conception and this unit aims to provide learners with an overview of the roles and responsibilities of parenthood alongside an understanding of reproduction and pre-conceptual, antenatal and postnatal care.</p> <p>This unit is split into 5 learning outcomes.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand reproduction and the roles and responsibilities of parenthood • Understand antenatal care and preparation for birth • Understand postnatal checks, postnatal provision and conditions for development • Understand how to recognise, manage and prevent childhood illnesses • Know about child safety <p>The unit will be assessed via an external exam in summer 2018; it will be worth 50% of the final grade.</p>
Development and completion of unit from Year 10; R019: Understand the equipment and nutritional needs of children from birth to five years.	10 hours	<p>This unit will allow learners to investigate the different equipment and nutritional requirements of children from birth to five years. On completion of this unit, learners will be able to apply their knowledge and understanding, through a practical activity, to show how the needs are met to promote the well-being and development of the child.</p> <p>This unit was completed in Year 10 but pupils will be encouraged to expand on their work and show greater depth of learning bringing in their knowledge for other units.</p> <p>It is a collection of work to submit as controlled assessment worth 25% of their final grade.</p> <p>It is planned that this unit is to be submitted to the exam board in January 2018.</p>
Theory for unit R020: Understand the development of a child from birth to five years.	8 hours	<p>This unit will introduce the last unit: R020. It allows learners to investigate the developmental norms of children from birth to five years. Learners will develop an understanding of the impact of play on the developmental norms.</p> <p>As this is only introductory work to the unit; it will focus on the first learning outcome which 'understands the physical, intellectual and social developmental norms from birth to five years.'</p>
